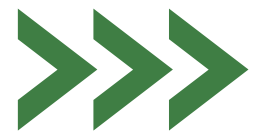

SUSTAINABLE CROP PRESERVATION, TRAINING AND MARKET LINKAGE TO REDUCE POST-HARVEST LOSSES FOR WOMEN FARMERS

ABOUT MOMMAS ON FIRE - BE(E) THE CHANGE PROJECT



In Lungalunga, a sub-county of Kwale, Kenya, most children under 5 and pregnant or lactating women are acutely malnourished and families are at "crisis" levels of acute food insecurity.



This region has one of the highest rates of girls not in school due school fees and teen pregnancies.



60 mothers of the community teamed up to break barriers as women beekeepers. Through apiculture, pawpaw fruit farming and reforestation of indigenous trees they are able to pay for the education of their daughters.



The project's impact will be multiplied as the Mommas on Fire Apiary will become a free training center to 300 neighboring mothers who wish to become beekeepers themselves.



VOICES OF WOMEN IN AGRICULTURE

Pauline Mutinda is a passionate and philanthropic farmer with a heart to serve marginalized girls to access education. Farming was a natural choice for her after retirement from civil service. She has donated two acres of land for the Mommas on Fire Bee keeping project.
